- Ohioans age 60 and older are eligible for the COVID 19 vaccine. The COVID-19 vaccine is available to residents 60+ as of March 4 in <u>Phase 2</u> of the program. Ohioans who work in childcare services, law enforcement or funeral services can also receive the vaccine. Pregnant women, those in need of a bone marrow transplant or who have been diagnosed with ALS or Type 1 diabetes are also now eligible as part of <u>Phase 1C</u> of the program.
- I was invited by WOIO-CBS 19 to participate in a public service announcement about the COVID-19 vaccination. The PSA will air on WOIO=CBS later this month. As a community leader, my goal is to encourage viewers, and residents, to educate themselves on the immunization process.
- Congratulations to Councilwoman Vivian Walker. The Elite Women Around the World[®] (EWAW) for developing women leaders. The 2021 Community Leadership Award goes to Woodmere Village Councilwoman Vivian J. Walker.

- The Village administration applied for the Healthy Urban Tree Canopy Grant Program and was one of 28 municipalities to do so.
