WHEREAS, Faye Callahan earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement Administration from Kent State University and went on to work as a Special Assistant to Cleveland City Council President George L. Forbes, active with University Circle Inc, and was acknowledge by President William Jefferson Clinton for her tireless community and civic work; and

WHEREAS, Faye Callahan worked in the field of Public Affairs and Media Relations representing the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District; Ohio Department of Transportation; Department of Veteran Affairs, and the Cleveland Water Department with meritorious service; and

WHEREAS, Faye Callahan was a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated for 48 years, a private, not-for-profit organization, whose purpose is to provide assistance and support through established service programs in local communities throughout the world; and
