Meetings: American Rescue Plan Act Funding for Non-Entitlement Units, Ohio Fire Chiefs (Health, Safety, Wellness, Legislative, and Policy Committees), and Ohio Public/Private Partnership 2021 Summer Seminar

Fire Prevention: Beechmont Towers Demo Walk-Thru; Corky and Lenny's, Eton (Launch Work, Marvel and Plastic Surgery, Mitchell, Tiffany, and Texas De Brazil), and Taste of Kerala

Station: Exhaust system unit damage, Engine 1 (Generator Exterior Switch Out of Service, Ladder Rack Out of Service, Warning Lights and Auto-eject plug are malfunctioning), SCBA Cylinders (End of life-15years), Suction Unit Battery (End of Life – Likepak-12 Batteries and Cascade System (Out of Service), portable/apparatus radios nearing end of life/software mandate, and 2 Walkie Talkies in for repair work)

Staffing: Scheduling Impact of COVID-19 and New Members Hired: 4 Home Quarantines, 7 Positive COVID-19 EMS Transports, 3 Members Tested COVID-19 Negative, 7 Members Tested COVID-19 positive 4 new members hired (April, May, & July) and backlog in pre-employment background checks

Training: EMS: (Amputations, Blast Injuries, Crush Injuries, Drownings, Impalements and Confined Space Incidents, Driver Training, EMS Charts, Geriatric, Lifepak 15, and Ventricular Assist Device)

Fire: (Basement Fires, Critical Event Management for Severe Weather Incidents, Disaster Recovery and Resiliency, Driver Training Fire Service Cancer Risk Reduction, Engine Operation/Pump Training, Fire Rescue Academy, Full Scale Hazmat/USAR Exercise, Ground Ladders, New Technologies for Aerial Fire Trucks, Recovery Plan Reporting, Scene Size-up, Two Way Messaging, and Whole Community Inclusion in Emergency Management.

Fire is DEADLY!


Smoke and toxic gases kill more people than flames do.
